Freedom from Coercion

I. Policy:

Every individual receiving services will be free from coercion or any behavior that forces, threatens, intimidates, or uses other unethical means to influence individuals.

II. Standards:

The following rights will be afforded all individuals receiving Home and Community Based Waiver Services:

- 1. Individuals will be provided information about their rights, at least annually, in a manner that every individual can understand.
- 2. Individuals will be provided information about how to file a complaint should their rights be violated by staff or any other persons in the setting.
- 3. There will be no retaliation for individuals exercising their rights, including their right to file complaints.
- 4. Rights will be posted in public areas, where all individuals can view in a manner and language that can be understood by individuals, their guardians/families, and others.
- 5. All staff will be trained on their rights, including their role and responsibilities to ensure the protection of their rights.
- 6. The HCBS Settings Compliance Checklist, issued by the ADMH-Developmental Disabilities Division in July 2022, will be used in training staff on all rights including providing guidance to staff on how to practice and apply these rights.
